Conference Description

The purpose of this conference is to provide up to date clinically useful information to rheumatologists including the most recent advances and information on the pathogenesis, diagnosis and management of selected rheumatologic diseases.

Objectives

At the conclusion of this educational activity the participants should be able to:

- apply knowledge of pathophysiology of reactive arthritis to appropriately utilize antibiotics in patient treatment.
- recognize the biology of new RA therapeutics and use these treatments for more effective care of patients.
- develop a differential diagnosis for neurologic complications in SLE and SS to discern whether neurologic symptoms in SLE and Sjogren's are related to disease activity or previous damage.
- recognize PAH in connective tissue disease and apply appropriate therapy based on severity of disease.
- apply knowledge of the role of genetic shifts in the development of autoimmunity to facilitate discussion of autoimmune disease with patients.
- implement treatment recommendations and enhance therapy for the difficult patient.
- appraise the utility of neuroimaging, CSF studies, and biopsy in differentiating CNS vasculitis from mimics in order to accurately treat patient.
- utilize knowledge of Hepatitis C to safely treat patients with Hepatitis C and rheumatic disease.
- introduce similarities and differences between ICD-9 and ICD-10 to ease apprehension regarding transition and allow for focus on patient care.


